Paul is the author or editor of several books on the history of the church and of higher education, including [The Oxford Handbook of Presbyterianism; Faith, Freedom, and Higher Education: Historical Analysis and Contemporary Reflections; Princeton in the Nation's Service: Religious Ideals and Educational Practice, 1868–1928; Church, State, and Public Justice: Five Views; and The New England Watch and Ward Society](#). He recently facilitated a faculty discussion group on “Faith for the Common Good,” funded by the Lilly Fellows Program in Humanities and the Arts.
